She is associated with the transcendentalist movement and her book *Woman in the Nineteenth Century* is considered the first major feminist work in the United States. Ossoli was a teacher and then worked for the New York Tribune. Her reputation as a well read person helped her become the first woman allowed to use the Harvard University library. The Tribune sent her to Europe as the first female correspondent, where she became involved in the Italian revolution. She was an advocate for prison reform, emancipation of the slaves and womens rights particularly in the area of education. In the summer of 1843, she traveled to Chicago, Milwaukee, Niagara Falls and Buffalo, while traveling, she interacted with several Native Americans, including members of the Ottawa tribe and the Chippewa tribe.
